Mountainview is located in a beautiful, semi-rural area about one kilometer from the center of Salatiga, Indonesia. Salatiga is located central to the major cities and cultural centers of Yogyakarta, Solo, and Semarang, making the school 1.5-3 hours from three international airports.

School

Mountainview was founded as the Central Java Inter-Mission School in 1981 to serve the families of expatriates living in Indonesia, primarily those involved in the work of various service organizations. Mountainview Christian School is a K-12 boarding and day school with a current enrollment of approximately 230 students from a number of countries and backgrounds, with the largest number of representatives from the United States, South Korea and Indonesia.

Curriculum

The **academic program** is organized on a rotating block schedule. Students take six 85 minute block classes and two 50-minute classes. Students attend three block classes and the regular class daily. Block classes are year-long; each block class meets every other day. **Block scheduling** was instituted in 2012.

These AP® courses are offered: Calculus AB, Capstone, Computer Science and US History. **AP is an open-enrollment program.** In addition, many students are planning to take AP tests in subjects we do not offer, therefore we offer an additional hour of subject instruction to help students prepare in the following: Calculus and World History.

Technology

Campus wide WiFi access connects students and staff to a world of information. In addition, an investment in technology made every classroom a global connection point with projectors or TVs . Both elementary and secondary schools have computer labs that are equipped with the latest hardware and software. The internet is upgraded to a dedicated fiber optic connection from Salatiga to Jakarta making it the fastest available in our area.

Student Body

Mountainview hosts a diverse student population.

Boarding:

The school offers two, centrally located, on campus dormitories. Both dorms are staffed with professional “dorm parents” with food and laundry services and high speed internet. Capacity for 16 boys and 16 girls. (grades 7-12)

Extracurricular

Major Musical or Drama production annually. In 2012 it was a production of William Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, set in pre-colonial India. 2016 featured *Disney's The Little Mermaid Musical*. This production featured one half of the secondary students on stage and behind the scenes.

Community Orchestra

Battle of the Books* The academic competition assigns students readings in teams which they are tested on in a “quiz show” type format.
