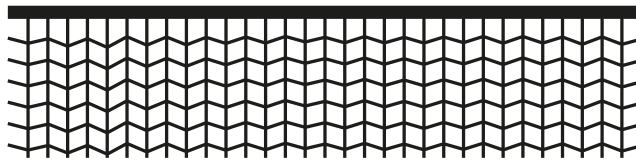
# SIS Volleyball Tournament

“I feel good about our overall performance, even though we lost, we put in a lot of effort, stayed focused, and supported each other from start to finish.” -Jaden-

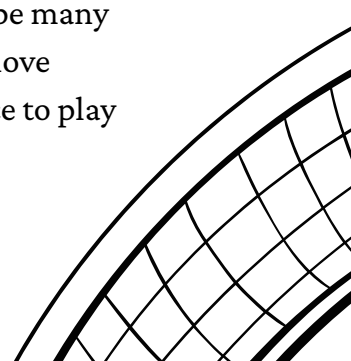
## **What do you think your team did best during the tournament?**
