It's just been awesome to see our athletes not only play their hearts out but also represent our school with such great character. This year will definitely be one to remember.

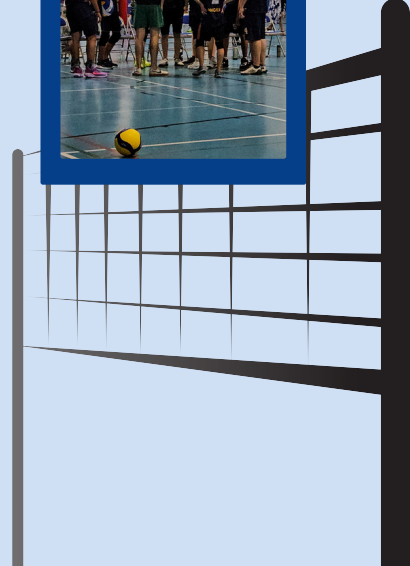
