



FROM HASHTAGS TO HEADLINES:
HOW MEDIA IS SHAPING POLITICAL
POWER AROUND THE WORLD

In the age of smartphones and social media, world politics no longer occurs behind closed doors. Today, political movements are born from tweets, shaped by videos, and powered by likes and shares. However, while mass media helps spread awareness and spark action, it also raises serious questions: Who controls the story? And how much can we trust it?

### Why This Matters to You

Even if we're not old enough to vote, we're still part of the political world. We form opinions, share posts, and shape conversations. That's why media literacy, knowing how to question what we see online, is more important than ever.

### Here's how you can take action:

- Think before you share: Is it verified? Is it balanced? Is this information true and reliable?
  - Follow diverse sources: Don't get trapped in an algorithm bubble that leads to a certain topic that might not be important but is exaggerated.

    Watch out for fake news: Try to distinguish between fake news and biased information that can mislead

you and your society.

### Media Is a Tool: You Decide How to Use It

Mass media, from newspapers to TikTok, aren't just about watching the world; they're about being part of it. If we use it wisely, we can be informed, united, and powerful. If not, we risk being divided by misinformation and noise.

### Mass Media: The Invisible Hand in Global Politics

For decades, traditional media like newspapers and television have played a key role in connecting people to politics. They report on elections, expose corruption, and highlight social issues. According to Britannica, mass media helps the public stay informed and encourages leaders to be more accountable. However, the media doesn't just report the news; it decides what becomes news. This is what researchers refer to as the "agenda-setting" effect. When an issue receives repeated media attention, it becomes part of public discussion, even if more important topics are overlooked.

## Click, Post, Protest: The Rise of Digital Democracy

The article "Mass Media in Social and Political Participation" highlights how social media has changed everything. Now, anyone can share opinions, launch campaigns, and even organize protests from their phones. Movements like the Arab Spring, #MeToo, and #BlackLivesMatter demonstrate how digital platforms can be powerful tools for justice. However, it's not all good news. The same tools that spread truth can also circulate lies. The study warns that fake news, political bias, and online echo chambers can mislead the public and increase division, especially among young people who rely heavily on social media.
